
Napton Padel Project: Summary of Proposals

1. We propose to install two floodlit padel courts at Napton Sports Field, with online booking and linked secure entry system. Local people will benefit from priority access and discounted booking fees ensuring the facility is inclusive and accessible for the whole community. The following image shows the proposed site location.



2. A survey of villagers shows:

- 99% of responders are either "extremely supportive" or "supportive"
- Separate discussion with residents in proximity i.e. 100m or less from the proposed courts showed they are supportive.

3. Project Capital Costs

- The estimated capital costs for build and commissioning 2 Padel Courts is between £175,000 to £195,000, including a 10% contingency fund.
- We anticipate that this will be financed through:
 - Interest bearing loan capital
 - Grants and Award donations
 - Sponsorship and Partnership donations
 - o Community Investment (Napton Padel Bonds)

4. Income based on LTA suggested utilisation rates:

- LTA projected activity data for a two-court facility that predicts an average court utilisation rate of **50% in Year 1** rising to **95% by Year 3** and beyond.
- Court fees for doubles 'pay to play' use being an average of £7 per person per hour; (Coventry Padel charge 'pay and play' up to £16.50/person/hr, Bicester charge up to £8.50/person/hr)
- Monthly membership fee of £20 with court fees being an average of £4 per person per hour. (Equivalent or less than other Padel courts)
- Villagers receive 25% reduction on these prices for the first year.
- 5% Interest bearing loans account for 50% of operating capital, to be repaid over 3 years
- Balance of operating capital funding from gifts, grants and sponsorship incurring no repayment costs.

The projected financial performance assumes 100 members in year 1, increasing to 300 in year 3, and where half of the members are from Napton and only 30% utilisation increasing to 95% in year 3 with 300 members:



The project will generate a **net operating surplus from year 1**, which will be reinvested into:


- Phase 2 of the Padel facility
- Ongoing improvements to Napton Sports Field
- Broader community sports and recreation initiatives
- Support Napton Parish Council in well-being and sports initiatives

5. Proposed Timetable








HOW INTERESTED WOULD YOU BE IN PLAYING PADEL? 9%




- Padel would be a fantastic addition to the village

Take Home Messages (174 respondents)

- 1. About half the respondents have never played Padel
- 2. 68% of respondents say they will play at least once a month
- 3. Despite half the respondents never having played before, 85% say they are extremely or somewhat interested in playing
- 4. 99% of people say they support (or "maybe" support) the idea of Padel in the village – despite 12% of people saying they themselves would not play
