#### Specific Items appropriate to Napton

<u>Southam Fire Station</u> – whole time staffed in day since 1/7/25, new appliance unveiled last month, Open Day 2<sup>nd</sup> August

<u>Highways</u> – Issues raised at last month's meeting inspected by localities officer and jobs raised. Some street furniture, signs etc have been stolen, damaged or defaced – WCC aware. Community Speedwatch is still awaiting vetting from the Police. If Napton PC is happy, I will put in a bid to HCAF for a comprehensive road safety audit (including bus locations) plus funding of any subsequent works, signs, equipment etc. Highways issues raised at Napton PC meetings need to be put in writing and sent to me.

Planning Enforcement case - being reviewed

WCC Cllr Grants available until later in Month (paid for defib last year)

<u>Aldi</u> – hopefully open by Christmas – S278 works start on Southam by pass this month, may cause some delays.

#### **General report**

I don't usually comment on national politics in my local weekly update but the breaking story about the new political party Zarah Sultana is likely to join left me wondering if she is going to be in charge of currant affairs and fund raising!!

Extremely busy week as usual- meetings at SDC and WCC as well as attending training and briefings. I still get many queries from people about things that are nothing to do with me or not in my ward.

Councillor Bromwich and I chased the grass cutting around the area – No Mow May had extended several weeks !! Belatedly I believe it has now been completed, though I am happy to be corrected. As Chair of Overview and Scrutiny at SDC, I've asked for it to come to a future meeting of the committee.

#### Local Government Reorganisation (LGR) for Warwickshire

Whoever pays the piper calls the tune – a report commissioned by Warwickshire's Districts and Boroughs favoured a two unitary option for Warwickshire. I bet the report commissioned by Warwickshire County Council will favour a single unitary option for Warwickshire – I will be most surprised if it didn't.

I know some SDC Cllrs have concerns that the Districts and Boroughs' report fails to answer questions relating to Social Care, SEND, Highways or the Fire Service. Comments I've heard was that it contained vague nice words and was short on substance, short on details, and contained a lot of ifs and buts.

I think residents will be best served waiting until both reports are available, reading them together, not in isolation. Consultation on LGR is likely to begin in 2026, I will post more details when things become clearer.

**Stratford District Council** has updated its housing land supply position to take account of the revised standard method for Local Housing Need. The changes to the NPPF and the new methodology for Local Housing Need mean that the previous calculation is now out of date. **The Council can currently demonstrate the equivalent of 5.06 years' worth of housing land supply.**

PLEASE REPORT ANY ASB, however trivial it may seem. Small incidents can lead to bigger ones, so better to stop them before they escalate. Also, the more calls/incidents the Police have, the sooner they will realise there is a problem in a certain area. PLEASE ALSO ENSURE YOUR PROPERTY AND CAR IS LOCKED AND SECURE.
