Local Councillor update 310825 – Roadworks and HS2 road closure this week

EARLY Notice of road closure, A423, Southam September 2025 | from 8pm on Friday 5 | September to 6am on Monday 22 September 2025

_High Speed Two (HS2) is the new high speed railway for Britain. If you have any questions or enquiries about our work, please contact our Helpdesk to find out more. You can sign up for regular updates in your local area at www.hs2inwarwickshire.co.uk.

HS2 had wanted longer but several local councillors have been on the case and got the closure to a minimum.

Roadworks start on the Southam Bypass for the new junction into Aldi from Monday 1st September to potentially 3rd December.

I am pleased to inform you that the S278 works on the A423 Southam Bypass are due to commence on Mon 1st Sept, with the Streetworks Permit granted this week, allowing works to continue until 3rd Dec 2025.

I will endeavour to keep you fully informed of scheme progress for the duration of the works.

"Section 278 Highway works in connection with the consented Aldi Foodstore on Land off the A423 Southam Bypass, including the construction of a Ghost Right turn island, footway and cycle improvements and upgrade of existing Pelican Crossing at the Galanos Roundabout."

PAVEMENT PARKING/PARK IT RIGHT – the excuse, I won't be long isn't sufficient – it only takes a few seconds for a collision to occur. THINK ABOUT OTHERS NOT JUST YOURSELF

Every week, I get reports of some terrible parking – with cars blocking pavements (especially dropped kerbs), making it impossible for people with mobility scooters or with push chairs to get by, without going into the road. In some cases, too, emergency services vehicles (particularly fire appliances) would struggle to pass. PLEASE THINK OF OTHER PEOPLE, NOT JUST YOURSELF

PLEASE REPORT ANY ASB, however trivial it may seem. Small incidents can lead to bigger ones, so better to stop them before they escalate. Also, the more calls/incidents the Police have, the sooner they will realise there is a problem in a certain area. PLEASE ALSO ENSURE YOUR PROPERTY AND CAR IS LOCKED AND SECURE.
